Honorary Member Proposed

Griffin, of Colorado Springs, was the first Coloradan and possibly the first American killed in WWII on Dec 7, 1941, prior to the attacks on Pearl Harbor. He and his PBY crew were shot down while trying to take off from Kaneohe Bay after sighting approaching Japanese aircraft. Griffin was strafed and killed as he swam to shore.

The Council's net worth as of February was \$12,826.



This Will Ring Your Bell


Students of naval history, we now have a focal point to celebrate the history of the first three USS Colorados as we prepare for the fourth namesake of our great state.

A brief review: The first USS Colorado was a Federal 44-gun, three-masted, 3480-ton, steam frigate, commissioned in 1858 to enforce Federal blockades against Confederate trade in the waters of the Gulf of Mexico, the Caribbean and the Carolinas, English waters, and the Mediterranean Sea. She later served as the flagship of the European and the Asiatic Squadrons.

Spring 2016 Halyards 2 The second was the 504-foot-long, 13,900-ton Pennsylvania-class, armored cruiser, USS Colorado (ACR-7), commissioned in January, 1905, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Her builder, William Cramp & Sons Co., also built the 1858 USS Colorado. The bell from the first ship was recovered and reissued for the second USS Colorado (ACR-7). The cruiser USS Colorado (ACR-7) saw duty in World War 1 and participated in the 1908 Great White Fleet cruise.

The third USS Colorado (BB-45) was a 625-footlong, 32,600-ton battleship (first of its class) commissioned in August, 1923, in New Jersey. She saw significant action in the Pacific, and reportedly fired more 16-inch shells than any other battleship. Thanks to the effort of the USS Colorado (BB-45) Association, that noble battleship's bell and helm were placed on display in the Lounge of the University of Colorado Memorial Center in Boulder. The Memorial Center was declared by the Colorado Governor in 1947 to be "a memorial to those who served in these great wars."

Let's bring this together: Through the stalwart efforts of LCDR (Ret) Cecily Harsh de Gutierrez and CAPT (Ret) Julio Gutierrez, of the Colorado Springs Navy League Council, with assistance from Dick Cooper and Carlos Garcia of the CU Boulder Memorial Center, the bell that was shared between **USS Colorado 1 and 2** was located and retrieved from warehouse storage in the Navy History and Heritage Center, Washington, D.C. It Spring 2016 *Halyards*

has been refurbished, transported to Boulder, and placed to sit proudly alongside the bell from USS Colorado (BB-45). Recognition is given to Norris Hermsmeyer of the USS Colorado (BB-45) Association for personally funding the transportation of the bell from storage in Virginia to its new home in Boulder.

We anxiously await the **fourth USS Colorado** (**SSN 788**), the 15th Virginia Class submarine, currently under construction at Electric Boat shipyard in Groton, CT. It is expected to be commissioned in early 2017.
